Brian Fehrenbach joined the Canadian nuclear industry in 2003 to help Atomic Energy of Canada Ltd develop partnerships with companies in Japan, as well as to help develop and implement change management priorities. In this role, Brian oversaw managers and staff at CANDU sites around the world and led the successful introduction of CANDU technology to non-CANDU applications in Japan and Taiwan. Following the takeover of AECL by SNC Lavalin and a series of organizational changes Brian joined Ontario Power Generation in 2016 to help develop their subsidiary company Canadian Nuclear Partners (now known as Laurentis Energy Partners). Also during this time, Brian led the creation of another OPG subsidiary in Romania called Canadian Nuclear Partners S.A. to provide services to SNN Romania and beyond. In 2021, Brian joined the Organization of Canadian Nuclear Industries (OCNI) and shifted focus to supporting the entire Canadian nuclear industry, including the development of a pan-Canadian nuclear supply chain through OCNI's Ready4SMR Program. This program will better enable the Small Modular Reactor projects planned across Canada to be successful, and ultimately lead the Canadian nuclear supply chain into global opportunities towards a clean energy economy. He also led OCNI's international activities through the Canadian Government's CanExport program and other opportunities that represent areas of potential growth for the Canadian nuclear industry. Brian and OCNI received tremendous feedback about these programs and the benefit to small and medium sized member companies. Now with NWI Precision Brian is gaining a deep understanding of manufacturing nuclear components and pressure boundary assemblies.
